


# YEAR 6 TERMLY NEWSLETTER: AUTUMN TERM 2018

## WELCOME TO YEAR 6!

It is great to see that all the children have settled into their new class routines and are enjoying learning. We hope that your child is looking forward to a rewarding and successful year. Year 6 is full of exciting themes, trips and even an opportunity to take part in a residential! We would like to share with you some information about what your child will be learning over the Autumn Term, as well as offering you opportunities to support your child's understanding of subjects studied.

<b>HIGH EXPECTATIONS</b>	<p>We expect a <b>high standard of behaviour from all children</b> which is monitored by all staff in the academy. The Behaviour Policy (which can be found on our website) explains the academy rules, rewards and sanctions in detail.</p> <p>Every week we have a celebration assembly where achievements are shared and certificates are awarded (including Star of the Week and House Points certificates).</p>	<b>UNIFORM</b>	<p><b>Uniform is the same for Years 4-6.</b></p> <p>All pupils must wear correct uniform, including acceptable footwear. A letter will be sent home with pupils who have missing or incorrect uniform.</p> <p>Please refer to the Uniform Policy on our website for further information, including PE kit. If you require academy uniform, all items can be purchased from the academy office.</p>	<b>START OF DAY ACTIVITY (SODA)</b>	<p>For the first 15 minutes of every day there will be a focused learning activity planned by the teacher. If your child arrives late they will miss this vital part of the school day. Therefore, it is important that your child arrives on time (<b>by 8:55am</b>) every day.</p>
	<p>Unacceptable behaviour, both in and out of the classroom, will be dealt with firmly but fairly according to the academy's Behaviour Policy. You will be informed of any major incidences, or if your child's behaviour results in two or more detentions within a period of two weeks.</p>	<b>TRIPS</b>	<p>Y6 have three educational visits planned for the Autumn Term. As part of the music curriculum, they will be attending a virtual orchestra. To launch the topic 'Right to Fight', they will be watching a play about World War I at the Brite Centre. Finally, to finish the topic, they will spend the day at Beaumanor Hall, experiencing what Christmas was like for a child in World War II.</p>		
					

<p style="writing-mode: vertical-rl; transform: rotate(180deg);"><b>YEAR 6 CURRICULUM</b></p>	<p>Over the Autumn term, children will learn about two topics:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Raging River – a comparative study of the River Soar in Leicester and the River Ganges in India.</li> <li>• Right to Fight – a history topic looking at World War I and World War II</li> </ul> <p>Please see the sheet attached to this newsletter for more information about these topics in Year 6 this term.</p>	<p style="writing-mode: vertical-rl; transform: rotate(180deg);"><b>PHYSICAL EDUCATION</b></p> <p><b>Our PE days this term are Tuesday and Friday.</b> PE is part of our academy curriculum and <b>we expect all children to bring a full PE kit to school</b> so that they can take part in their indoor and outdoor PE sessions. PE kit can be left on your child’s peg in their classroom.</p> <p>This term we will also be going <b>swimming on Tuesdays.</b></p> <p><b>All jewellery must be removed.</b> Earrings need to be removed on the day of PE or the child must be able to remove these themselves before the lesson. Teachers and Teaching Assistants are not allowed to help children remove their earrings. If your child has recently had their ears pierced they will have to bring micropore tape to cover their earrings until they can take them out.</p>	<p style="writing-mode: vertical-rl; transform: rotate(180deg);"><b>HOMEWORK</b></p> <p><b>Queensmead Quests</b> will continue to be given out once per half term. The aim is to provide a range of challenges for your child to choose from. We would be grateful if you can support and encourage them. If your child experiences any difficulties with the homework, we encourage them to come and see their class teacher for more support.</p> <p>In addition, we expect children to be <b>reading for at least 10 minutes daily.</b> It would be really beneficial if you could listen to your child read and discuss their book regularly to support their understanding.</p>
	<p style="writing-mode: vertical-rl; transform: rotate(180deg);"><b>SPELLINGS</b></p> <p>These will be practised in the classroom daily but should your child wish to continue at home, please support them to do this.</p>
