Draw or paint a picture of what you think you might look like when you grow up.



How will you have changed? Will you be really tall? Will your hair be long or short? Will your hair have changed colour? What job would you love to do when you grow up? Write some sentences about what you might be like and what job you might do

You could be a teacher!



Play schools! Your teddies and dolls could be the children in your class.

Or maybe you can teach your brothers, sisters or grown-ups! Make a timetable for the day! Do the register! Teach some phonics and numbertime! Make sure everyone has their snacks! Listen to children read and give them a smiley face if they try really hard!

You could help a grown up in the kitchen! Maybe cook some spaghetti, or bake some cakes or melt some chocolate to make rice crispy cakes. Make sure you wash your hands before you start and listen to your grown up's instructions so you keep safe in the kitchen.
